




City of Houston Facts

- 2,800 miles of roadside ditches
- 3,600 miles of storm sewer lines
- 100,000 inlets
- 60,000 manholes
- 16,000 lane miles of roadways
- 1361 bridges

Who is Street & Drainage?

The Street & Drainage Division is responsible for the safe operating condition of the city's streets, bridges, drainage ditches and storm sewers.

The Division consists of the following branches: Administrative, Storm Water Maintenance, and Street and Bridge Maintenance. Each branch is responsible for one of the Division's main functions in maintaining and supporting the City of Houston's infrastructure.

- Drainage Assessments
- Water Quality Assessments
- Storm Sewer System Inspections
- Road Repair and Resurfacing
- Storm Sewer Repair and Replacement
- Bridge Maintenance and Construction
