




City of Houston Facts

Street & Drainage Maintains and Inspects:

- 2,400 miles of roadside ditches
- 3,850 miles of storm sewer lines
- 115,358 inlets
- 80,252 manholes
- 16,000 lane miles of roadways
- 1360 bridges

Who is Street & Drainage?

The Street & Drainage Division is responsible for the safe operating condition of the city's streets, bridges, drainage ditches and storm sewers.

The Division consists of the following branches: Administration, Storm Water Maintenance, and Street and Bridge Maintenance. Each branch is responsible for one of the Division's main functions in maintaining and supporting the City of Houston's infrastructure.

The Division Performs Many Activities:

- Drainage Assessments
- Water Quality Assessments
- Storm Sewer System Inspections
- Road Repair and Resurfacing
- Storm Sewer Repair and Replacement
- Bridge Maintenance and Construction
